We are looking for someone who is willing to pick up items for dumpster day at resident's homes and bring the items up to the dumpster. We will hand out your phone number and you can negotiate price for the service. Some neighbor's don't have hauling ability. Call the office if you are willing to help.

## SPRING CLEANUP DAY

The Colonial Village spring clean up day is **Saturday, May 11th from 8am- noon** (Rain or Shine).

Colonial Village provides large dumpsters so that you can do your spring cleaning and dispose of large items **AT NO CHARGE!** (see box for couches and mattress charge) The dumpsters will be located in the parking lot behind the office. Only Colonial Village residents may participate in this clean up. The costs of this service continue to escalate so please only bring items from your household. Note the list of items we can not accept.

We will have a one way street to the dumpsters; one vehicle at a time. Please wait until the person leaves before pulling ahead.

### Metal Curbside Pick Up Friday

Curbside pick up of some larger metal items is available the day before cleanup on Friday, May 10th. **RESERVATIONS REQUIRED!** You must call the Colonial Village Office to be put on the pick up list. Items include ranges, dishwashers, washers, dryers, water heaters, BBQ grills, lawn mowers, snowblowers, bikes, computer towers and hard drives, miscellaneous metal. These items must be outside by 9:00am the morning of May 10th. Please do not put anything out before then as it would be a health code violation. Other debris must be brought to the dumpsters on Sat. May 11th.

**Guest parking lot closed Thursday 5/9 through Saturday 5/11th**

Annual lot inspections have begun. Dispose of it now, so you don't have to pay for it later. We provide this service so that we may all have a neighborhood we are proud of!

## Healthy Chicken Salad

3 cups cooked chicken chopped or shredded  
2 stalks celery diced  
1 cup red grapes halved  
1/2 cup thinly sliced almonds  
3 green onions sliced  
3/4 cup plain Greek yogurt  
1 Tbsp Dijon mustard  
3 Tbsp fresh lemon juice  
1/2 tsp celery seed  
Salt and pepper to taste



In a large bowl mix together chicken, celery, grapes, almonds, and green onions. In a separate bowl, whisk together yogurt, Dijon mustard, lemon juice, celery seed, and salt and pepper. Drizzle the dressing over the chicken mixture and mix until all combined. Cover and store in the refrigerator. Serve with crackers, on slices of bread, in a wrap, or on lettuce as a salad.



### PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE SQUIRRELS

Some of our neighbors have squirrels nesting in their engine compartments and causing significant and costly damage to the vehicle wiring. Often the damaged happens more than once for these folks.

Squirrels are destroying lawns and robbing gardens. Feeding them upsets the balance of nature and is not good for the animals.

- There are risks to wildlife. Animals that rely on human foods can stop naturally hunting or foraging and starve.
- You can help keep wildlife wild. Never feed wildlife, clean up and leave no trace and keep your distance.

**A:** Household Hazardous waste:

Electronics: Free disposal at Repowered, 860 Vandalia St, St. Paul. Search: "Ramsey County Electronics recycling" for hours.

Tires: Any tire retailer must take tires for recycling. There will be a charge.

Branches: Branches may be brought to the bin behind the storm shelter. **No grass or leaves may be dumped behind the storm shelter. Only branch disposal.**
